The July 12th Catfish Rodeo was a huge success with 74 participants bringing in 451 lbs of catfish. Over \$1,000 worth of prizes were given out! We fertilized the lake the first weekend in July and will be fertilizing again next weekend, the 2nd of September. The fertilizer we are using will not affect fishing so continue fishing while we take care of the lake for you. The 6 fish feeders located in the lake are producing good fishing so make use of them. We will stop feeding the middle of October and will not start back until next March.


