To All Property Owners at Lake Eddins

Due to required dam repair Lake Eddins will be lowered approximately 5 feet beginning Monday, Feb 4, 2013. Hopefully the repairs can be made in a quick and timely manner sometime after Feb. 4.

The repairs should take 2 weeks or less once they have begun, weather permitting. Boats should be either raised on a lift or taken out of the water. This would be a good time to do any needed shoreline

stabilization. This would also be a good time to work on seawalls, boat-houses, docks or piers.

More details will be given when they are known.

The reason for Lake Eddins water level to be lowered is to repair a slippage at the upper part of the dam on the water side just as you start across the

dam from the west (gate) side. We were going to try and wait until early summer but the latest rains have caused the slippage to move closer to the road and the road is in danger of being damaged. The professional Engineer we consulted has recommended for the safety of the dam and the road that the repair be completed now.

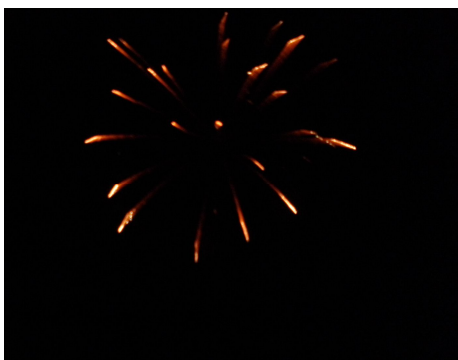
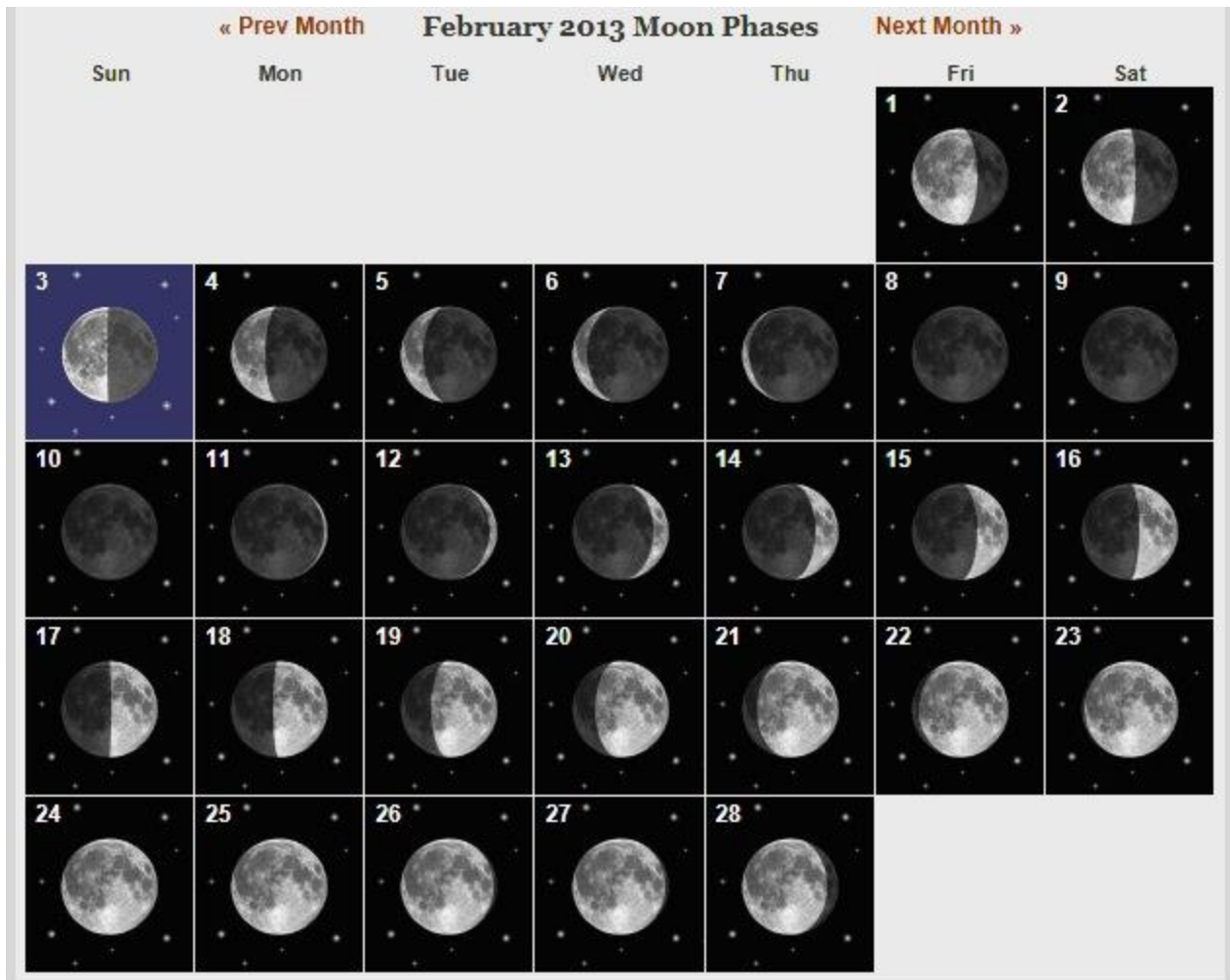
From the Fire Chief
