A Reminder From The LEOA Board

We have had several unauthorized boats on the Lake fishing recently and when asked they stated that someone let them in the gate. We will start using the video camera recordings to identify the ones using their cards to allow unauthorized vehicles in and take appropriate action.

We also are having more boats on the Lake at night without their lights on. This is against Lake Rules and creates a dangerous situation for themselves and others. Excerpt from the Lake Rules governing boats, please read and heed.

REQUIRED

A card holder authorized to use common areas must accompany guests while fishing/boating on the lake and on all other common areas at all times. Guests using their own boats are required to maintain a maximum distance from the Member's boat that would allow a normal conversational voice to be heard.

All boats must meet state requirements for personal floatation devices and lighting.

All boats on the lake after sunset must have their side lights and the all-round white light on at all times.

EMERGENCIES at Lake Eddins:

If you have an emergency, day or night the first number to call is of course 911. If it is other than a fire emergency ask them to also "call out" the Lake Eddins Volunteer Fire Department. The LEVFD usually will get there quicker and can assist with gate access and directions for emergency vehicles.
